

Chief Radio Officer Steve Reynolds is always prepared for disaster

In case of a disaster in Marin, whether fire, flood, or earthquake, Civic Center Volunteer **Steve Reynolds** is ready for action. He is the chief radio officer for Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service/ Auxiliary Communications Service (RACES/ACS), a group of more than 40 radio operators who volunteer to use their personal radio equipment to back up county radio systems during emergencies.

Steve works closely with County Emergency Services Coordinator **Tom Jordan** of the Sheriff's Office. "Steve and his group of RACES/ACS volunteers provide the county with radio communication capabilities that far exceed the reliability of most conventional, infrastructure-dependent systems following a major disaster," explained Tom. "Steve enthusiastically

takes on the many challenges involved with running an all-volunteer emergency response team. Without his positive attitude and patient approach, several key elements of the RACES/ACS radio communications program would not exist."

RACES/ACS members are screened by the Sheriff's Office and train weekly. They receive formal field training by participating in county disaster preparedness drills. Some members provide radio support for public events, such as community bike and foot races. Others participate in local emergency preparedness fairs, belong to a local radio club, and interact with Sonoma and San Francisco ACS groups that provide mutual aid and support.

Seven years ago, Steve completed Community Emergency Response Team training and became involved in amateur radio communications. Then four years ago, he became chief radio officer for RACES/ACS. He retired from a 35-year consulting career with a firm doing air quality studies. He received his chemical engineering degree from Cal Tech.

He and his wife Mary Anne live in San Rafael and enjoy opera, exploring Marin, and travel.

Steve said the close-knit radio group is always looking for new members and helps newcomers further develop their skills. "When I see a group like RACES/ ACS working together to perform a mission well, it is very satisfying," he said.
